Phase I Grading	The initial reading of all essay responses.	
Phase II Grading	The re-reading of all applicants whose combined essay and MBE scores are 260 or greater and less than 272. Each essay is read by a different grader with no knowledge of the Phase I score.	
Phase III Grading	The re-reading of each essay whose Phase I and Phase II scores differ by more than one (1) point.	
Prior Applicant	An applicant who has taken a previous exam. A prior applicant must follow standard application deadlines.	Applicant Re-applicant
Re-applicant	An applicant who has taken the exam <b>immediately preceding</b> the exam to which s/he is applying. A re- applicant is subject to the re- application deadlines.	Applicant Prior Applicant
